Hello All,

With Kym away this week, I have added a few words below regarding the open forum on Monday the 29th re: the St Elmo planning application for a new Care Home.

Thanks to all those that could make the meeting. I gave an overview of the process thus far, the outcome of the compulsory mediation in late June and also the altered plans that have been submitted for the VCAT hearing in September.

The home has been reduced by 12 beds to make the building shorter and further away from the creek bed.

The planning team and Barrister (specialised in building) believe we have covered off all requirements to be successful in VCAT.

The decision is now up to the VCAT members hearing the case in September.
