










## VILLAGE MANAGER REPORT

Hello Glengollan Residents

After the last week sending us some lovely clear days, Winter seems to be well on top of us now.

There seems to be quite a few residents unwell and I have a feeling this might be a nasty season for coughs and colds. Can I please remind everyone, if you feel unwell, to stay at home and to protect yourself when you're out shopping or in areas with a high volume of people. It's probably a good idea to start wearing a mask.

Personally, I hate wearing a mask but prevention is easier than cure and it's in everyone's best interest to try to protect yourself. This is especially relevant for those on your own, who then become reliant on family and friends to assist you and I'm including myself in this scenario. I think we have an obligation to try and be mindful of the impact this has on others.

I'm sure the majority of you have torches and batteries ready for any power outages. For those that don't, it's probably a very good idea to have at least one on hand. I understand there are also torches available that you can hand wind. Either way working on the theory if you have it, you may not need it, but if you don't, then things can go topsy turvy and you'll be left in a bother. It's dark so early now and the nights are long. That can be very difficult without any lighting and please no candles, they are so dangerous.

We welcome Tim to our team as the new Maintenance Supervisor and not forgetting Vinnie, Greg and our regular trades. One of these members of staff is rostered to be on-call after hours. The RN on duty knows who to contact for a response. Generally, I do not have my work phone with me on weekends and turn it off if I am away or unwell. In these instances, the calls or messages will be delayed in receiving a response as opposed to calling the main office number. It would be helpful if you could put the main office number in your phone 9758 1093, listen to the choices (press 5 for reception) and the call will be directed through 24/7. When the office closes, the Care Home will take emergency calls. If the call is not an emergency, please call the office during business hours. Thank you in advance for your understanding and co-operation.
