RESIDENT COMMITTEE REPORT - May 2022

Hello All

Once again, we had quite a productive meeting in May.

The problem with taxis not being able to find their passengers has hopefully been solved with a sign erected on the fence at gate 4 in Hutton Avenue directing drivers to the pickup point.

The ongoing problems with NBN at NCC are still being worked on and we now have a similar situation with some of the units in Storen Close. Unfortunately, the NBN organization are not the easiest or most co-operative people to deal with.

Quotations for lights in some of the darker areas of the village are being sought and these areas will be fixed in time.

Date for the book sale has been settled for 18th June, only a little over 3 weeks away.

A number of suggestions were made for the expenditure of the money raised at the fete and this has been cut down to a short list. We will continue to work on this in conjunction with the Social and Events Committee to obtain the best result for our residents.

One suggestion was for emergency alarm buttons to be installed in each unit, but the cost of this is prohibitive. Also, there is not a staff member available to respond to these emergencies. We are planning to work with the Social and Events Committee to organise 2 or 3 different organisations to come to the clubrooms and explain what is available in the way of personal medical alarms. More on this when it has been organised. If anyone is interested in learning about these, we would certainly like to hear from you.
